559th BS records state "as the formation flew over the target Lt Henry Powers was forced to go on single engine as a result of a power loss in one engine. Consequently he was forced to fly straight and level, after the rest of formation had turned. Lt Powers and his two crew men flew straight into a four burst salvo of flak

Lt Alexander Windsor flying in a/c 659 received a direct hit which shot off the tail section. The a/c exploded in mid air shortly after. Three parachutes were reported

Lt Powers jettisoned his bombs in enemy territory and crash landed safely at FLORENNES

I was flying as Tail Gunner with Lt LEIGHTY when I first noticed Lt WINSOR'S ship was on fire and dropping out of formation. At that time another plane diverted my attention and when I looked back for the flaming plane, it was near the ground. I saw the explosion that followed immediately after the plane went in.

EYEWITNESS STATEMENT OF SGT PEDICORD.

I Was flying as Waist Gunner with Lt FALLOON when a series of explosions attracted my attention to Lt WINSOR'S plane. It was hit by several rapid bursts of flak and flames were seen to come from the open Bomb Bay. The plane then split in two and the bombs fell from the plane almost immediately following the explosion. I then noticed two chutes about 4000 feet below that must have come from the rear of Lt WINSOR'S plane. I followed the plane down until it hit and did not notice any more chutes.

Flying as Tail Gunner with Lt FALLON our flight was on the Bomb Run when I saw several bursts of flak hit Lt WINSOR'S ship in the open Bomb Bay. A terrific explosion followed and the plane was seen to split in two. Pieces flew in all directions. I was forced to look at another plane and when I turned back I noticed two chutes and what might have been a third. I did not see the plane go in.
