HISTORY OF THE NATIONAL ORDER OF THE LEGION OF HONOR



During the French Revolution all the orders of the kingdom were abolished. It was the wish of Napoleon, the First Consul, to create a reward to commend civilians and soldiers regardless of their stature in life. In 1802, a **Légion d'Honneur**, (Legion of Honor) was established as the first modern order of merit. The **Légion** was open to individuals of all ranks and professions. The order is France's highest award and is conferred upon men and women, either French citizens or foreign nationals, for outstanding achievements in military or civilian life.

The President of France is the Grand Master of the Order and appoints all other members of the Order — by convention, on the advice of the Government. Its principal officers are the Chancellor and Secretary-General. The order has five classes: Grand-Croix (Grand Cross); Grand Officier (Grand Officer); Commandeur

(Commander); Officier (Officer); and Chevalier (Knight).

BIOGRAPHY

Technical Sergeant Erwin C. Powell, 101, U.S. Army Air Force, was born in Stockton, CA in February 1924 and graduated from Stockton High School in 1942. He was the only child of Edith and Isaac Powell. Erwin entered active service in March 1943 in Stockton, California and did Basic Training in Monterey California, Advanced Training radio operation in Sioux Falls South Dakota, aerial gunnery in Las Vegas Nevada, and air crew advanced training Barksdale Louisiana. He arrived in England in late June 1944 and joined the 391st Bomb Group, 572nd Bomb Squadron, flying B-26 Marauder bombers as a radio operator and aerial gunner. In September 1944 the 391st Bomb Group was moved to Roye-Amy Airfield, France, then in April 1945 to Asch Belgium, a former Luftwaffe airfield. Tech Sergeant Powell completed 55 bombing missions in the European theater including 18 over France. His campaigns included Northern France, the low countries and Germany. Erwin returned to the U.S. and was discharged at Camp Beale, California on 14 July 1945. His significant decorations include the Air Medal with 9 Oak Leaf clusters, the EAME Campaign Medal with 2 battle stars, the Good Conduct Medal, and the Distinguished Unit Citation. After the war Erwin obtained a degree in Business from Humphreys College in Stockton, California and was employed there with Southern Pacific Railroad, a cannery & JB Beard Steel. He and his family moved to San Jose in 1959 where he worked as an accountant for Modern Ice and Cold Storage for 25 years until retiring in 1984. In his retirement, he worked for H&R Block until 2013, officially retiring at 89. In recent years he has volunteered with the Arvada Historical Society. Erwin was married to his late wife Nancy for 66 years and their family includes 5 children (Ed, Nick, Dean, Sharon and Diane), 5 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren. He resides in Arvada, Colorado in an active senior living community.
