Special Operations Warrior Foundation

Founded in 1980 after eight special operations men were killed and one incapacitated during the Iranian hostage rescue attempt, leaving behind 17 children.



The Special Operations Warrior Foundation provides post secondary scholarship grants, not loans, to all children of special operations forces who have lost a parent in an operational mission or training accident.

The special operations community includes, but is not limited to, Army Rangers and Special Forces personnel, Navy SEALs and Air Force special operations personnel, including Combat Search & Rescue. These personnel are stationed in units throughout the United States and overseas bases.

Since 1980 the special operations community has lost more than 400 personnel leaving behind more than 500 children. To date, 66 children of fallen special operations warriors have graduated college, and 80-100 of our students are expected to enroll in colleges and universities across the country this Fall.

Members of America's elite Special Operations Forces will run a 335-mile relay from Fayetteville, N.C. to Washington, D.C. to raise money for some very special children – children of special operations forces who died as a result of an operational mission or training accident.

With nicknames like "Commandos," "Nightstalkers" and "Quiet Professionals," Special Operations Forces are respected around the world for their discipline and training. As our nation continues its war against terrorism, America depends upon Special Operations Forces — consisting of Army, Navy and Air Force personnel – to conduct more missions, in more places, and under a broader range of conditions than ever before.
